Dear Sir,

In answer to yours of Nov. 3rd, I regret that I have not a copy of my brief notes upon P. virens, but I send you an extract from which will furnish you with my conclusions.

1. That Protomycetes violaceus Cesati is not a fungus, but a hypertrophy degree (degeneration?) of the lenticelle (little cells piccole celle?) which are produced in the bark of the roots and trunk of the mulberry.
2. That the lenticelle are produced in different ways, and among others ~~affatto~~ by the rupture across the lume (non posticatae lume in esendo pratico de leimini) of all the

cells in one stratum, with the escape
of their contents consolidated in the
form of forf^{surf.} forfora (cosa ra forfora.ua
so)

3. That very probably the so-called 'male del falchetto' is not caused by these violet spots which surround the roots, because these are found in healthy as well as in sickly trees and in young ones as well as in old ones, and also, under similar forms, in several other plants without any traces of injury

I have written to Mr. Berlese for a copy of the paper published by him in the Revue Mycologique &c: and as soon as I have an answer from him or a copy of the work, I will let you know. remain dear sir yours faithfully G.G.
